**ARPA — ~~ARRP~~ FUNDS USED FOR NEWARK HALL RENOVATIONS**

Renovations are now complete at the Newark Township Hall. Newark used all of their \$110,000.00 and \$40,000.00 of Gratiot County's ~~ARRP~~ ARPA funds. There were stipulations placed on these funds and Newark felt the Renovation of the outside of the building along with a new furnace and AC and lighted Exit signs in the interior were a great investment for all of the Newark Township Residents. "Newark Township Hall Smiles Again" Contractors were all local and did a great job. Including: Plumb Line (Scott Haynes) for Roof, siding and cement porches, Wendell's Electric for Electric and notice those nice lights in the parking lot when you leave the building after dark, E&S Graphics for the Signs, CMS-Internet for the cameras we now have two on the building and Twin City for the Landscaping, and Lakeside Electric and Smith Mechanical for the furnace and air. These funds needed to be spent by the end of 2024.

**HEARTLAND WIND PROJECT COMPLETED**

Heartland Wind Project is now complete. Invenergy will be supplying gravel for 10.5 miles in Newark Township that was the component route for the turbines.
